Curtains (General)

Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a vacuum with the appropriate attachment, or a microfiber/static duster. Lint rollers are great for pet hair.
- For spot cleaning, dab spills with a damp cloth, and blot stains with diluted gentle soap. Never rub, always blot.
- Draw curtains back during the day and avoid direct sunlight to prevent fading.
- Always check the care label before laundering.

Blockout or Blackout Curtains

Blossom Blinds recommends:

- A steamer is an effective and easy way to refresh curtains without removing them.
- Gently sponge clean outdoors of line curtains with mild detergent and rinse with cold water.
- Let dry naturally in the shade. Do not fold or tumble dry.

Sheer Curtains

Blossom Blinds recommends:

- Gently shake to remove dust.
- Use a damp sponge for spot cleaning, with mild detergent and white vinegar for stains (spot test first).
- Hand wash gently. Remove all hooks or rings before washing.
- Hang in the shade to dry and refresh.





Roller Blinds

Roller blinds are a type of window covering, known for their ability to control light and privacy. Cleaning roller blinds is easy and can be done yourself or professionally. To do it at home, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- Fully lower the blind. Use a vacuum cleaner with a soft brush attachment, or gently wipe with a feather duster or microfiber cloth.
- For light marks, use a clean, damp cloth, and avoid soaking the fabric. For best results, gently blot rather than rub.
- For stubborn stains, try a mild dishwashing detergent solution on a cloth or sponge. Always spot-test in a hidden area first. You can also lightly rub the mark with a soft eraser.
- Allow blinds to fully air dry before rolling them up again.



Honeycomb Blinds

Honeycomb blinds, also known as cellular blinds, are window coverings resembling a honeycomb. This hexagonal structure helps in regulating temperature and reduce energy costs.

They are know for their light filtering or room darkening feature, that depends on the type of fabric chosen. Thanks to their dust-resistant fabric, honeycomb blinds are low-maintenance, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a feather duster, microfiber cloth, or vacuum with a brush attachment. Compressed air can help remove dust inside the cells.
- For stains, use a damp cloth or colourfast sponge with a mild detergent solution. Avoid excess moisture and blot gently.

Note: For deep stains or delicate situations, consider professional cleaning.



Venetian Blinds

Venetian blinds are window coverings consisting of horizontal slats that can be tilted to control light and privacy. They are typically made of wood, aluminium, or PVC. Versatile Venetian blinds are known for their ability to provide both light control and privacy. Cleaning methods vary slightly depending on the material, Blossom Blinds recommends:

For Timber Venetians:

- Avoid water; instead, use a dry or barely damp cloth.
- For dusting, use a feather duster, microfiber cloth, or vacuum brush attachment. Clean each slat individually.
- For marks, use wood cleaner on a soft cloth and gently rub.
- Avoid prolonged sun exposure, alternate slat direction to reduce fading.

For PVC or Aluminium Venetians:

- A damp cloth and mild soap work well.
- For dusting, use a feather duster, microfiber cloth, or vacuum brush attachment. Clean each slat individually.
- You can vacuum gently with a brush attachment.
- Dry thoroughly to avoid water spots.



Vertical Blinds

Vertical blinds are window coverings made of vertical fabric panels, or slats, that hang from a track and can be tilted to control light and privacy. A great choice for large windows and sliding doors as they offer both light control and a sleek aesthetic to your space. Vertical blinds are easy to clean, but avoid removing the slats, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a vacuum brush attachment or feather duster on both sides of each slat.
- For stain removal, wipe gently with a damp cloth and a mild detergent solution. Dry while hanging—never fold or wash in a machine.
- For drying, keep slats tilted open to allow airflow for even drying.



ROMAN BLINDS

Roman Blinds

Roman blind is a type of window covering. It consists of a single piece of fabric that folds into neat horizontal pleats when raised, and lies flat when lowered. A stylish and elegant way to control light and privacy, Roman Blinds can be customized with various fabrics, colors, and patterns. Roman Blinds benefit from regular light maintenance, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a vacuum brush attachment or feather duster on both sides of each slat.
- For stain removal, wipe gently with a damp cloth and a mild detergent solution. Dry while hanging—never fold or wash in a machine.
- For drying, keep slats tilted open to allow airflow for even drying.



Panel Blinds

Panel blinds, also known as panel glide blinds or panel track blinds, are a modern window covering solution. They consist of wide fabric panels that glide horizontally for easy operation, with panels stacking neatly to one side or splitting in the middle when opened. Panel blinds require similar care as other fabric blinds, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a vacuum brush attachment or feather duster on both sides of each slat.
- For stain removal, spot-clean using a mild detergent solution and a soft cloth. Avoid soaking the fabric.
- For drying, let panels dry while hanging. Do not remove from the track.



PLANTATION SHUTTERS





Plantation Shutters

Plantation Shutters are window coverings consist of horizontal slats within a solid frame which allow for adjustable light and privacy control. The slats can be tilted to let in more or less light, and the panels can be opened and closed for full light and privacy control. For maintenance of plantation shutters, Blossom Blinds recommends:

For Timber & Fauxwood:

- For dusting, use a microfiber cloth or vacuum brush.
- For stubborn marks, wipe with a slightly damp cloth. Avoid heavy moisture.
- Avoid any kind of harsh chemical like bleach, ammonia, etc.
- Do not leave panels open long-term.

For Aluminium:

- Hose or rinse with water outdoors.
- Clean using mild detergent and sponge.
- Air dry or wipe with a cloth to prevent water marks.



Roller Shutters

Roller shutters are window or door coverings consists of horizontal, interlocking slats that roll up and down, that cab be operated manually or electronically. They are known for their security, insulation, and privacy. For maintenance of roller shutters, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- Cleaning frequency should be at least every 6 months.
- For dusting, use a microfiber cloth to remove loose dirt.
- For washing, wipe with mild detergent and warm water, then rinse with clean water.
- Clean with a soft brush and ensure dry before use.
- If installed at height, hire a professional to ensure safety.





Security Doors & Flyscreens

Security doors and Flyscreens are a great way to keep your home safe and secure, and away from bugs. However, over time, they can become dirty and grimy. If you want to keep your security door and screens looking its best, it's important to clean them on a regular basis.

Here's how Blossom Blinds recommends to clean and maintain security doors and flyscreens in just a few simple steps:

- Hose down, then clean with a soft sponge using car wash
 & wax mixed with water. Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Remove dust and grit with a soft brush.
- Clean with a microfiber cloth using detergent solution.
- Rinse well and dry to avoid streaks.
- Avoid soaking the locking mechanism.

How Often Should You Clean your Security Doors and Flyscreens?

- Every 3–6 months, if you're living in a typical suburban areas
- Monthly if you're living near the coast (salt air can be corrosive)
- Following storms or dusty weather to remove buildup

Automated window coverings, also known as motorized or smart window coverings, are window treatments that can be controlled electronically. To maintain the smart devices such as remote, Blossom Blinds recommends:

- For dusting, use a dusting glove to remove debris.
- Wipe remotes with a clean cloth, never submerge in water.
- Keep all components in a clean, dry place.
